Highlights of Our 2018-2019 Impact

Over **274,000** total Early Learning Guides distributed to families across Pennsylvania.

11 Scholarships given to undergraduate and graduate students including Key Club and Circle K.

Over **\$26,000** in grants and program funding awarded to 8 Pennsylvania Kiwanis Clubs and service leadership organizations.

5,570 dozen roses sold by Pennsylvania Kiwanis members in 2018 to benefit Foundation Programs.

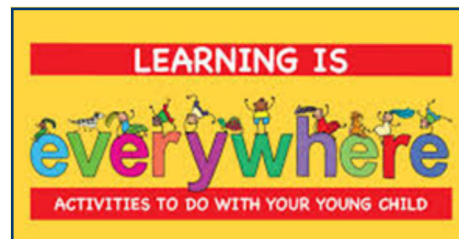
Our Impact with Early Learning

Our Early Learning Initiative

Pennsylvania Kiwanis continues to work and partner with the Pennsylvania Early Learning Investment Commission as a strategic partner of the Commission. We continue to be recognized by the Pennsylvania State Government for our work in the area of early childhood education and development. This year, the Foundation provided over \$33,900 in support of early learning program efforts including the distribution of early learning guides.

Distribution of Early Learning Guides

Pennsylvania Kiwanis continues to print and distribute Early Learning Guides to families across Pennsylvania. Through the work of Kiwanis clubs, to date, we have been able to impact children in 59 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties, with over 274,000 guides distributed to date. Kiwanis Family Clubs that are interested in distributing guides in their community can contact the District Office for pick-up or delivery options.

Our Impact with Service Leadership Programs

Service Leadership Program: Leadership Building

For many of the Kiwanis Family's younger members, joining a Service Leadership Program is the first step in a lifelong journey of service. It can even be their first leadership experience. For those who have a passion for it, opportunities for a deeper involvement can be an inspiration.

The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation continued our commitment to support the Pennsylvania Service Leadership organization by providing over \$11,000 in support of leadership building activities. This includes Pennsylvania Key Club, Circle K, Aktion Club, and Key Leader which provide valuable resources for leadership training and development as well as hands-on service. In addition, assistance was also provided for service leadership program administrator budgets.

Pennsylvania Aktion Club

The Foundation provided funds to the Pennsylvania Aktion Club for attendance and supports for its Annual Aktion Club District Convention held in Altoona, Pennsylvania.

Foundation Club Grants

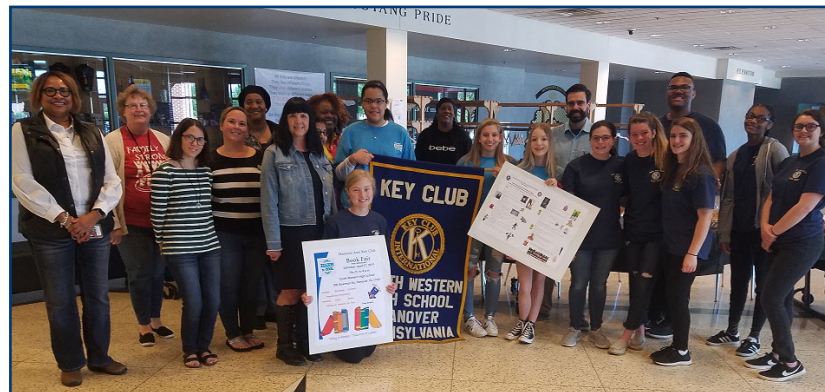
Many communities struggle to meet all the needs of children. We provide grants for Kiwanis-led, hands-on service projects that focus on health, education, and youth leadership development. The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation encourages Kiwanis-family service leadership programs and other projects involving young children to apply for grant funding. Requests for funding are only considered for Kiwanis-family clubs or programs. Grant decisions are made according to the annual grant review cycle at regularly scheduled Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation Board Meetings. This year, our Foundation awarded over \$11,000 with eight grants to Pennsylvania Kiwanis Clubs and Service Leadership organizations.

Hanover Area Book Drive and Fair

Key Club of Southwestern

April 2019

In April, the South Western High School hosted a book drive at which people donated used and new books. The community was invited to a book fair with authors, entertainers/performers, readings, hands-on projects for kids, contests, live music, vendors, food and drinks. The book drive and book fair were an attempt to provide resources to the area. The event's goal was to alleviate the restraints of low wages and the barriers of illiteracy and language by allowing access to the many programs and opportunities in Hanover. The event promoted literacy and the value of education. The goal was for every child to walk away with at least one free book and a sense of a future.

Polar Cares Clothing Closet

Kiwanis Club of Dillsburg

October 2018-September 2019

The Kiwanis Club of Dillsburg is working with the community to create POLAR CARES, a clothing and toiletries closet to provide for basic needs that may not typically be met in these families. Over 25% of students in Northern York County School District are considered economically disadvantaged. Many children do not have clean clothing, clothing that fits, the clothing needed to stay warm, basic items as socks and underwear, because it is considered a luxury. POLAR CARES hopes to eliminate these problems to provide for children.

Kiwanis Lending Libraries

Kiwanis Clubs of Norriton Circle, Conshohocken, and Valley Forge

October 2018

Local Kiwanis Club collaborated with the Montgomery County Intermediate Unit #23 Early Learning Programs (MCIU-ELP) to establish a lending library in the Early Learning Academy (ELA) site. The ELA site provides free preschool/social services to 200 Head Start, 100 Pre-K Counts, and approximately 80 Early Intervention children and families. The majority of these children and families do not have access to books in their home, impacting their ability to develop strong literacy skills required for academic success.

Kids United Community Playground

Kiwanis Club of Williamsport

January 2019-November 2019

Kids United Community Playground is a collaborative community project to create a playground where disabilities disappear and inclusive play is promoted for all children, enhancing the quality of life of children and families through fitness and socialization. The club is building a positive, healthy, fun environment inspiring our community to learn, imagine, and play together. The playground will be built at Thaddeus Stevens Primary School centrally located in the city limits. The playground will offer a safe place for families to gather in a low-income section of the city for leisure and physical activity.

Learn 2 Read, Read 2 Learn

Kiwanis Club of Carlisle

October 2018-September 2019

Studies show that promoting literacy at the elementary school level is critical to instilling the importance and love of reading. If children cannot read proficiently by the end of third grade, they face hurdles to success in school and beyond. To address this need in the community, the Kiwanis Club of Carlisle provides developmentally appropriate books chosen by school personnel and purchased from Scholastic Books to about 800 children in kindergarten and 2nd grade three times during the year thereby allowing these children to build a personal library of their own regardless of family finances.

Kiwanis Kids Day

Kiwanis Club of Edinboro

February 2019

The Kiwanis Club of Edinboro conducted its first-ever Kids Day in early February. The event was open to children in the community ages 3 to 10. There was no charge to anyone however donations were asked to support the local food pantry. Among the activities were make-and-take crafts, plastic canvas bookmarks, button and heart pictures, and wooden ornaments as well as cornhole games, duck toss and dancing. Presentations included amazing balloon sculptures by The Real Magic Steve and “magic” tricks by a University physics professor. In addition, a photo booth was donated for the enjoyment of the children. Not to be forgotten—a reading circle was set-up to reinforce the Kiwanis literacy effort in the community with Kiwanis information and early learning guides were also available for all of the adults to take for their families. A chocolate fountain, drawings for a boy’s and girl’s bicycle, and a raffle auction for the adults rounded out the afternoon of fun. Assistance from members of Edinboro University Circle K, Hermitage House Key Club, General McLane Key Club, and members of the Edinboro University’s football team also made the day successful. With the positive response, the club is looking forward to planning for next year’s event!

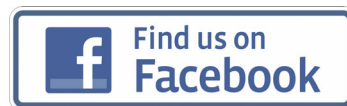
